Winter

Inevitably, Summer on the Pond is followed by Winter on the Roof and there are some key actions we need to take to keep our homes safe from winter's attack.

- ❖ Keep the thermostat no lower than 65 degrees to avoid problems with frozen pipes, mold or mildew. Do this even when you are away from home for long or short periods of time.
- ❖ Disconnect outside water hoses.
- ❖ Keep a clean filter in the furnace.
- ❖ Open cabinet doors on super-cold nights and allow a slow stream of water to run throughout the night from kitchen faucets.
- ❖ Consider installing heating cables on the roof over enclosed patio rooms.
