Jeanne Albert displays her first place ribbon

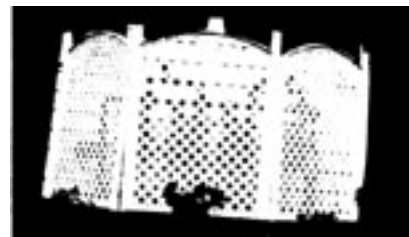

Here's an idea to hide gas meters. This screen is available at Lowe's.



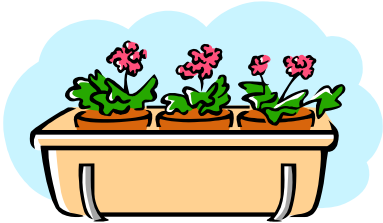


* **Golfers:** Call Ed McClurg or Stan Gale to join the WLHA golf leaguer. Play is open to all WLHA residents.
