

Pool Opening



The new concrete tiles have replaced the grass border and the pool is opening Memorial Day Weekend.

Water aerobics will begin on Thursday, June 3rd and continue each Monday, Thursday, and Friday from 10 to 11 a.m. Ann Whiley will be our instructor once again and the cost is \$3.00 per session payable before the workout begins. The phrase on the calendar "weather permitting" means that the air temperature must be 70 degrees or higher for the water aerobics class to be held; call Weather Line-289-2511 to be sure. The pool is heated early in the summer but that will be eliminated as the air temperature rises.

Take time to review the pool usage rules in your homeowner's handbook. Residents must accompany all children.

A volunteer is needed to take a weekly water sample to Sherry Laboratories and report the results to the County Health Department. Call Jack Donati to help.
