Clubhouse Temperature Control

Due to very high energy costs, which we all must pay, the Board requests that all clubhouse users be responsible for controlling the thermostat before and after use. Please adjust the thermostat about 2 hours before an event to 70 degrees in the winter and 78 degrees in the summer. Upon leaving the clubhouse, adjust the thermostat to 58 degrees in the winter and 85 degrees in the summer.

The board appreciates your effort to help us all save money that would be wasted by heating or cooling an empty room.

Spring Mulching.

The following buildings are due for mulching this spring when weather allows. Buildings 7 through 14, 22,24,28,29, and Duplexes 1 and 4. Building numbers are listed on the resident address list.

The fountains, which are not currently working, will be repaired and back in operation when weather allows repairs.

VOTING INFORMATION

The primary election to select candidates to run for office will be held **May 2**. WLHA residents vote at University Christian Church, 2400 N. Nebo Rd. You will need a photo I.D to vote.

The deadline for registering or transferring registration for the primary election is **April 3**. You can register to vote at any license branch or the county building. You can also register on line at <http://www.in.gov/sos/elections/>. If you need an absentee ballot, you may obtain one online or by calling the phone numbers below for more information.

Absentee ballots may be obtained starting April 3 and must be in the County Clerk's office by noon on **May 1**.

WILLOW LAKE BRIDGE

Quick and Easy Baked Salmon For Two

2 five ounce salmon filets
1 teaspoons olive oil plus 1 tablespoon
Salt and freshly ground black pepper
2 tomatoes chopped
or
One 8 ounce can chopped tomatoes, drained
1 chopped shallots
1 tablespoons fresh lemon juice
1/2 teaspoon dried oregano
1/2 teaspoon dried thyme

Preheat oven to 400 degrees
Sprinkle salmon with 1 teaspoon olive oil, salt, and pepper. Stir the tomato, shallot, and 1 tablespoon of oil, lemon juice, oregano, thyme, salt and pepper in a medium bowl to blend.

Place each salmon fillet, oiled side down, atop a separate sheet of foil. Wrap the ends of the foil to form a spiral shape. Spoon the tomato mixture over the salmon. Fold the sides of the foil over the fish and tomato mixture, covering completely; seal each packet closed. Place the two foil packets on a heavy large baking sheet.

. Bake until the salmon is just cooked through, about 25 minutes. Using a large metal spatula, transfer the foil packets to plates and serve.
